

## **Bible Holiness Assembly of God** **Camp Peniel Rules**

**Rules are for everyone's good. We expect the cooperation of both campers and workers. You are important, but are not the only one here. Please DO the following:**

1. Do register as a camper (or worker - age 19+) and be in the dorm area only with a counselor. Day guests: Please register as a camper or worker. Registration is \$10.00 per day & \$3.00 per meal payable to the Camp Director.
2. Do bring written parental permission for disciplinary or medical procedures (located on registration card.)
3. Do attend all sessions. Separate seating for ladies and gentleman except for night services. (Gentlemen on the left, ladies on the right.)
4. Do always behave as a Christian lady or gentleman. Couples should not hold hands, embrace, etc., wander off alone, nor loiter in dimly lit areas.
5. Do park, lock and turn in car keys to Camp Director if you are a camper or teenage worker. **Any worker or camper should get permission from Camp Director before leaving campgrounds.**
6. Do turn in valuables, fireworks, knives, radios, tape players, CD players, MP3 players, I-Pods, or any questionable items of literature to your counselor immediately. Legal items will be returned.
7. Do keep grounds clean. Willful damage will be chargeable to those responsible. **No refreshments (gum, candy, drinks, food) in Tabernacle area.** HATS OFF IN TABERNACLE, PLEASE.
8. Do report all injuries immediately. Always wear shoes.
9. Do pray as long as desired after services. Campers should pray on their particular side. Those done praying should obey all rules and go to dorm when sent. At dorm, observe quiet time and lights out. **After lights out NO ONE IS TO LEAVE HIS OR HER ROOM WITHOUT A COUNSELOR.**
10. Do plan your appearance to meet these guidelines:  
Campers & Workers: Dress neat and conservative. All outerwear T-shirts are subject to approval by Head Counselor for acceptability. (May have your name, church slogans, school or numbers.) No earrings, necklaces, body piercings, makeup, nail polish or acrylic nails. We reserve the right to exclude any attire deemed objectionable. **If in doubt, DON'T.**  
**Gentleman:** Conservative style hair, off ears, eyes, and collar. Haircuts will be given where deemed necessary. No facial hair on campers (limited to mustache on workers). Shorts or cutoffs are not acceptable. We suggest that camp workers wear sleeves to the elbow. Campers sleeve length must be at least a 2 inch inseam.  
**Ladies:** Dress length: kids camper to knee, youth campers cover the knee at all times, all women workers at least two inches below the knee. Slits in skirts must be below the knee at all times. Slacks, shorts, culottes, cap sleeves, backless or sleeveless attire are not acceptable. Necklines must be discreet. We suggest that camp workers wear sleeves to the elbow. Campers sleeve length must be at least a 2 inch inseam.
11. Do turn your cell phone in to your counselor before first service. Cell phones may be used for an emergency or to call parents with a counselor present.
12. Any camper sent home will bear his or her own expense.
13. All daytime visitors need to be registered as a camper or worker. They will be required to pay for registration & meals and expected to cooperate with the Camp Guidelines and rules.

## SOCIAL MEDIA/INTERNET PHOTO FORM FOR CAMPERS AND WORKERS

Camp Peniel views social networking sites (Facebook, Instagram), personal websites and web blogs positively and respects the right of campers and staff to use them as a medium of self-expression and social interaction. If a camper chooses to identify himself or herself as a camper at Camp Peniel on such Internet venues, some readers might view the camper or staff member as a representative or spokesperson of the camp. In light of this possibility, Camp Peniel requires, as a condition of participation in the camp, that campers and staff observe the following guidelines when referring to the camp, its programs or activities, its campers and/or staff, in a social media method:

1. Campers and staff must be respectful in all communications related to or referencing Camp Peniel, its staff, and other campers.
2. Campers and staff must not use obscenities, profanity, or vulgar language.
3. Campers and staff must not use social media to harass, bully, or intimidate other campers or staff of Camp Peniel.
4. Campers and staff must not use social media to disparage the camp, other campers, or staff.
5. Campers and staff must not use social media to discuss engaging in conduct that is prohibited by Camp Peniel's policies, including, but not limited to, the use of alcohol and drugs, sexual behavior, sexual harassment, and bullying.
6. The use of Camp Peniel's copyrighted camp name or logo is not allowed without written permission.
